This year's Trailblazers Rising Impact Report celebrates the unstoppable force of girlhood. Across Minnesota, girls and gender-expansive youth are finding their voices, shaping their futures, and leading change right now. When they are seen, heard, and celebrated, they don't wait for permission to lead; they become the trailblazers our world needs most.

Our 2024 theme, The Gift of Girlhood, reminded us that girlhood is something to treasure and protect. We carried that spirit into 2025 with our rallying cry, Be Unapologetically You, a message and movement that reflects our belief in the power of authenticity and belonging.

The 28 girls and gender-expansive youth featured in this report embody that belief. Through their voices, we see courage, creativity, and conviction. They remind us that when we invest in girls, we spark leadership that shapes generations to come.

We brought this energy and engagement when 600+ people gathered for The Gift of Girlhood Annual Celebration (2024) honoring three extraordinary DreamMakers already driving change.

The launch of our first Girlhood Summit (2024) welcomed hundreds of youth to connect, learn, and share space in a day of leadership, joy, and empowerment. Each story and connection that day deepened our understanding of what it means to support girls and gender-expansive youth.

In 2025, we brought the Summit back and again saw hundreds of youth yearning to learn and also lead conversations, share their stories, and show the world what it means to be unapologetically themselves.

As we look ahead to 2026, we feel urgency and excitement. We will continue co-creating with youth, hosting listening sessions to ensure their voices guide what comes next.

More than anything, this report is a reflection of gratitude: to donors who fuel every grant, partners who walk beside us, parents and mentors who lift every dream, volunteers and board members who give freely of their time, and girls and gender-expansive youth who trust us with their ambitions and stories.

Your belief in the power and potential of girlhood sustains this movement and keeps it growing.

Goal: Share the key findings from evaluation results that confirm the importance of investing in experiences and activities for girls and fostering mentorships in their lives.

Total number of responses: **85**
(49 from spring 2024 grantees, 36 from fall 2024 grantees)
Total sample size: **272**

95% said that their funded activity helped them **learn more about themselves**



95% said that their funded activity **changed their life for the better**



94.5% said that their funded activity helped them **do something different than they would normally do.**

Before completing their activity, **70.5%** said they are proud when they try something new, even if it's **hard or if they fail.** After finishing their grant activity, **96.7%** said **they are proud when they try something new.**



Before completing their activity, **71.2%** said they were **confident in themselves.** After completing their grant activity, **98.8%** **feel confident in themselves.**

98% said they have an **adult (who is not in their family) that they trust** after completing their grant activity.



87% said that they **could not have participated or don't know if they could have participated in their activity without the grant.**

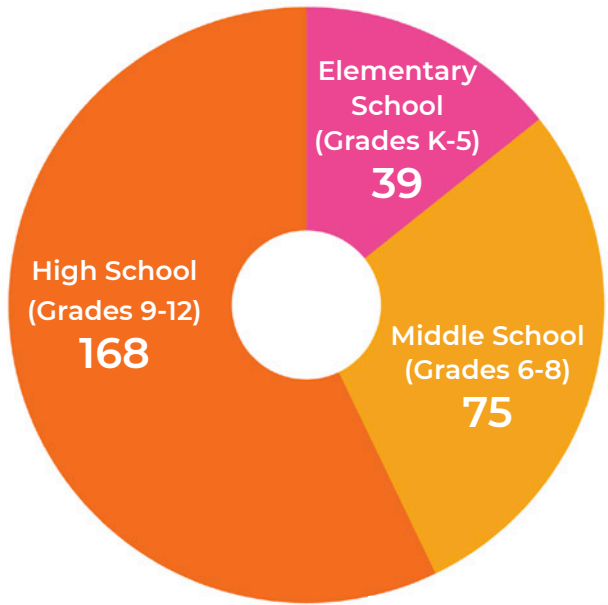

GRANTS BY REGION

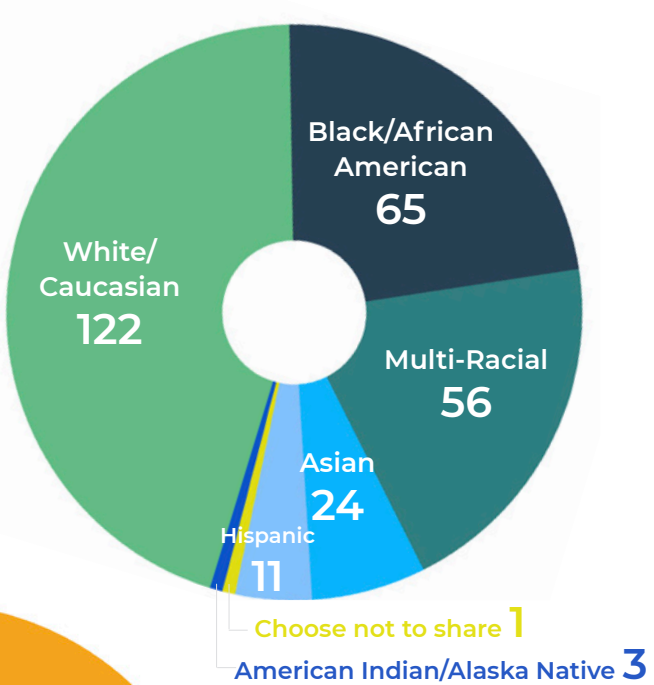
